

FIRES CAUSE 12 DEATHS IN STATE

SALEM (AP)—Fires claimed 12 lives and injured 128 other persons in Oregon during the nine-month period ending September 30 of this year, the state insurance department has announced.

Property loss amounted to \$1,723,887 from 2,970 fires reported on insured property. Losses paid were \$1,499,900.

Outside Multnomah, Coos county was highest in actual loss with \$157,924. Loss in Linn county was \$107,214, Washington county \$97,415 and Klamath county \$92,443. Multnomah county's loss was \$459,958.

Fires were most numerous in dwellings and outbuildings, 1,877 being listed in that class. Matches and careless smokers were blamed for 615 fires. Incendiaries accounted for 93 and "unknown causes" for 520 fires.

been charged with wanton waste. Officers today were to serve warrants on the men. The alleged violation occurred at Vey's ranch Oct. 26, officers say.

W. F. Baun, J. Doe Grant and John Doe, all of Bend, today were to be served warrants charging wanton waste of game. Warrants were mailed to the state police at Redmond for service. They are alleged to have buried the biggest part of three elk carcasses, which officers will attempt to prove were killed before the season opened.

J. P. Hadden, of North Powder, together with Fred Groust, were arrested Oct. 30 charged with possession of untaged venison and with wanton waste of game. They are in jail in lieu of bail, which was set at \$100 each.

Dean Dudley, of Athena, entered a not guilty plea to wanton waste of elk meat. Trial will be set later.

Hobart Johnson, arrested with Dudley, is facing the same charge. He did not appear before the court and a warrant has been issued for his arrest, state police say.

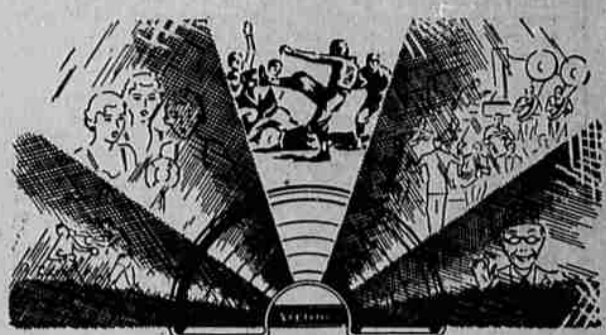
