 1-3 cup sugar  
 3 eggs  
 1/2 teaspoon vanilla  
 Melt butter, add flour and stir until smooth. Add milk, stirring constantly, and when it boils add the cocoa which has been mixed with hot water and the sugar. Add to the beaten yolks, cool slightly, add the stiffly beaten whites and flavoring. Pour into greased baking dish and bake in a pan of water until set, for about 30 minutes in moderate oven.
