UTAH'S VOTE 'BRINGS WET DAYS' BACK

Dry leaders conceded defeat in Utah before half of the precincts were heard from, and wets made gains in later returns. This gives that western state the distinction of being the 30th to vote ratification.

Ohio piled up a 600,000 majority for national repeal and voted out its state constitution prohibition amendment, although it is the birthplace of the anti-saloon league and the prohibition movement.

La Guardia Wins Driving a wedge into the Democratic stronghold of New York City, the Republican fusionist candidate, Fiorello H. La Guardia, won over Tammany hall's mayor, J. P. O'Brien, and Joseph V. McKee, recovery candidate backed by Postmaster General Farley.

This besides weakening Farley's drive for state control, also staggered the once powerful Tammany organization, which suffered its first defeat

since 1914. Frank J. Prall, Democrat, and Bernard S. Deutsch, L. Guardia running mates, were elected comptroller and president of the board of aldermen respectively. Ferdinand Pecora, stock market investigator, was defeated by William C. Dodge, Tammany candidate for district attorney of New York.

Another important Democratic mayoralty was lost in Cleveland. Harry L. Davis, Republican, won over Ray T. Miller, Democratic incumbent. Democrats failed in their drive to seize control of New York state assembly, even losing eight seats to Republicans, who also retained command of New Jersey's assembly.

But the Democratic slate swept Virginia. George C. Peery was elected governor and Harry P. Byrd United States senator. Frederick W. Mansfield, Democrat, won out over four other Democrats and two Republicans for Boston's mayoralty.

In Detroit, Frank Couzens, 31 year old son of Senator Couzens, Republican independent, was in the lead for mayor. Democrats made many gains in up-state New York.
