LOS ANGELES, Nov. 16 (AP) — Coach Howard Jones, Southern California's grid master, who usually concentrates on scoring touchdowns and lets others discuss rules changes came out today in favor of the idea of allowing an offensive team five downs in which to make ten yards when within the 20 yard line.

Coach Jones previously indicated he favored allowing the defensive team to run with a recovered fumble.

Coach Jones still favors calling a man down when he slips to the turf even in a clear field. "If this rule were taken out it would make for crawling again and naturally result in piling. I'm opposed to these bad features of the game."

OREGON HOPEFUL OF WINNING FROM TROJAN MACHINE

EUGENE, Ore., Nov. 16 (AP) — Determined to avenge their one-sided defeat by the University of Southern California last year and thereby to win the Pacific coast conference title, the undefeated and untied University of Oregon Webfoots were southward bound today for Los Angeles where they will meet the Trojans Saturday afternoon in their last conference game of the season.

Coach Frank Callison left Eugene by train last night with 30 players, his coaching and training staff and the team physician, and his farewell statement was of his belief that Stanford's victory over the Men of Troy can be duplicated and that Oregon is the aggregation that can do it. He added, however, that a hard game was anticipated as the general feeling was the Trojans would be fighting doubly hard to avenge last Saturday's defeat, their first in 28 starts.

Players going southward for the crucial battle include: Hughes and Swanson, centers; Clark, Cuppoletti, McCredie, Gagnon and Pury, guards; Eagle, Nilsson, Frye, Nelson and Bishop, tackles; Morse, Wishard, Pozzo, Simpson, Jones and McCoy, ends; Park, Terjeson and Arey, quarterbacks; Temple, Gee, Michak, Milligan, Van Vleet and Popelink, halfbacks, and Mikulak, Bobbitt and Rushlow, fullbacks.
