Three-Quarter Length Coats Back Again

By Rita Ferris (Associated Press Fashion Editor) PARIS (AP) — The three-quarter length coat is back again, strongly entrenched in fashion's favor.

It is popular among the new fur models for all-around wear, appears in wool luncheon time ensembles, goes to tea in the shape of velvet or fur and steps out again in the evening modeled of lame or velvet.

The knee-length coat of fur, belongs distinctly to the new season. Black and golden brown seal, muskrat, pony, astrakhan and gulyak are all used for the models which are generally cut to hang loose.

Evening wraps include many three-quarter length models based on two different designs. One of them, generally designed of velvet, hangs loose in the back with a jaunty air; the other, often fashioned of lame, is worn swathed closely about the hips.

Seven-eighth and three-quarter length coats give chic to many an afternoon ensemble. Many of the three-quarter length fabric coats are lined with fur, such as squirrel or lapin, to match the collar and cuffs.
