F. R. NAMES NEW AMBASSADOR TO CUBAN REPUBLIC

WARM SPRINGS, Ga., Nov. 25 (AP)—President Roosevelt is changing ambassadors at Cuba in the confidence of the early establishment of a government there meeting his conditions for recognition through stability.

Apparently satisfied that the provisional government of President Grau San Martin "will reach some peaceful agreement" in the "near future" which "may result in general support of government" he announced his diplomatic transfer suddenly.

Ambassador Sumner Welles after a return to Cuba to complete the "definitive" is returning to the United States as assistant secretary of state and Jefferson Caffery, present assistant secretary of state, is going to Havana.

Drives 40 Miles To Deal With A Blue Eagle Firm

Eastern Oregonians are taking their consumer pledges seriously, even to trekking 40 miles extra to deal with merchants who are playing the game according to Blue Eagle rules.

R. Z. Baxter, NRA chairman here, reported today that an Elgin man had driven in to La Grande to purchase a blasting fuse, rather than deal with an Elgin merchant who was not displaying the Blue Eagle. The keeping of his consumer pledge cost the customer a trip of 40 miles.

"This is not at all unusual," declared Mr. Baxter. "We find that people are inconsiderately themselves willingly, rather than deal with business men who refuse to cooperate with the president in the recovery drive."

Oregon-Idaho NRA executives in Portland, when told of the occurrence, included the spirit of the La Grande consumer.

"Buying where the Blue Eagle flies is the best way to assure the success of the recovery program," declared Will Simons, Boise, vice chairman of the district recovery board in a message to Mr. Baxter. "Merchants who are doing their part deserve preference over those who have not yet signed the reemployment agreement."
