RATE HIGHER BUT VALUES ARE REDUCED

The city tax amounts to 25.6 or in dollars and cents, \$123,812.41. The La Grande school district tax amounts to 21.2 mills or, \$111,731.14.

The millage for the high school tuition fund is .03 or \$3,114.00, but this is levied outside of high school districts.

The county valuation this year is placed at \$18,792,582.90.

Table showing tax levies for various funds: State Tax, Elementary School, General Fund, School Fund, Library Fund, Road Fund, Market Road Fund, Bond Redemption, Bond Interest, Total.

Taxpayers may pay their 1933 taxes next year in quarterly installments, in half, in three-quarters or in full.

Of course, there may be some individual exceptions where changes in valuations of property more than offsets the lowering of assessments, and in these cases, taxes may have to be lower.
