Old Age Pension Law Is Effective Jan. 1

All costs and expenses are borne by the county. A pension may be granted only if applicant "has no child or other person responsible under the law of this state for his or her support and found by the board to be able to support him or her."

Each application shall state all facts requested and a hearing shall be held. The board shall issue a certificate to the applicant to whom a pension is granted.

When a pensioner is an inmate of a benevolent home, the pension shall be applied toward defraying actual expenses. A pensioner shall receive no other public relief.

Any pension may be cancelled if found improperly issued. Penalties are provided in case of fraud.

Oregon Cabbage For New England

PORTLAND, Dec. 5 (AP) — Oregon cabbage will go into some of those belted dinners in the New England country. Already 75 carloads of Oregon cabbage have been moved out of Portland this season, and although efforts have been made to keep the destination a secret, it is generally reported that the recent heavy buying which forced prices higher was for movement into cold storage at inland Empire points.

N.R.A. Provisions Affect Employees In Grocery Trade

PORTLAND (Special) — Provisions affecting all employees in the retail grocery trade were received today by Frank Messenger, district compliance director, and were ordered into effect immediately by General Hugh S. Johnson, national recovery administrator.

The most important new provision in the code was the ruling that 75 per cent of the grocers and butchers in any trade area, by agreement, may determine the standard opening and closing hours, and that all butchers and grocers operating in that area must observe the regulations determined by this majority group.

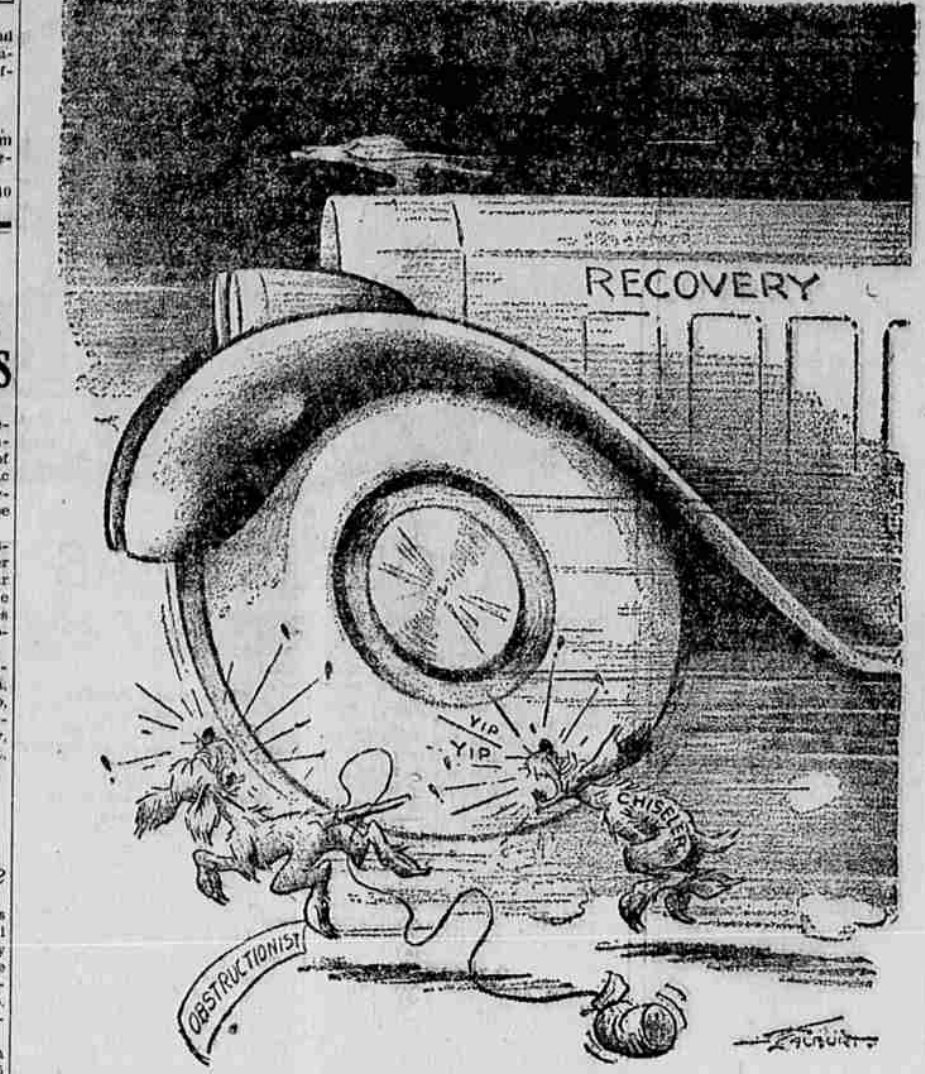
AT THE LIBERTY
