

HOMER GRIFFITH HURT; WON'T PLAY AGAINST HUSKIES

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 7 (AP)—With the crumpled list increased by the addition of Homer Griffith, senior quarterback, Southern California's football team went into another huddle with itself today, determined that its final game with Washington here Saturday shall not end in defeat.

Griffith probably will not be able to start the game because of an ankle sprained in the Georgia game. He is not likely to play more than a few minutes at best.

This means that Irvine Warburton, 147-pounds of All-American football fire, probably will be called upon to engineer the Trojan attack.

Warburton started his first game against Oregon and while he didn't do much running with the ball, he threw and caught passes with great regularity.

Since Warburton does both these things, packs the ball in long dashes down field and quick kicks too, Trojan followers have taken no time out to bemoan the loss of Griffith, if it comes to that, even though his play against Notre Dame and Georgia was one of the big features.

Then, too, there was Bill Howard, promising sophomore signal shooter.
