This Electrical Age!

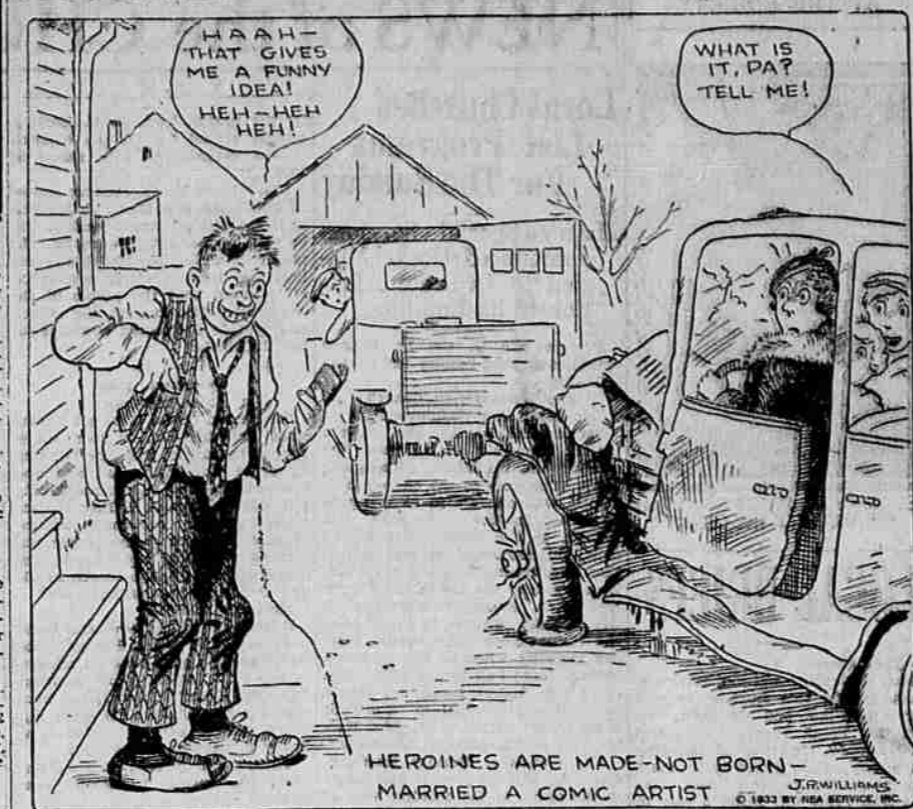
