Joe Waterman, widely known boxing promoter of Portland, is expected to share the refereeing task with Dick Russell, Chief Jim Steffen, and Charley Runyan. It was announced today. The box office at the Sacajawea arena is to open at 7 tomorrow night and the first fight is to start at 8:15. The winners in the bouts go to Boise representing Oregon in a two-state event next month.
