Expect Dr. Ingle To Attend Nat'l. Board Meeting

Dr. J. L. Ingle, well known osteopathic physician of this city, and a member of the American Association of Osteopathic Examining boards, has been invited to attend a meeting of that body in Wichita in connection with the 38th annual convention of the American Osteopathic association there next July. Osteopathic physicians are required by law to pass examinations before practicing in any state. Dr. Ingle is a member of the Oregon state board which examines these physicians.

It is only thirty-seven years since the first law was passed (in Vermont) to regulate the practice of osteopathy and, of course, there is yet much diversity among the various laws. Dr. Ingle, in a majority of the states, osteopathic physicians are licensed to practice osteopathy as it is taught in their colleges—that is, the diagnosis and treatment of disease in general, including the practice of obstetrics and of major and minor surgery. Representatives of the examining boards in the different states, by getting together and comparing findings and methods, are able to work out fairly uniform ways of dealing with the problems that arise. One important matter to come before next year's annual meeting is the question of reciprocity between the boards—that is, agreements providing that a person having passed an examination in one state and practiced there for a time, may be licensed in another state without going through another examination.
