morning. There still remain some projects before the state board, on which early approval is expected, and all indications are that Union county's full quota of 383 men will be at work before Christmas day. All who get to work not later than Thursday of this week will be on next Saturday's payroll.

Assignments yesterday included:

Imbler school district, seven men; city of North Powder (travelling streets), 11 men; removal of brick building at Imbler, eight men; Pumpkin Ridge road (between Sumnerville and Elgin), 10 men; County court house, four men; city of Union (travelling streets), 18 men; E. O. N. campus improvements, 15 men; Cove vicinity roads, 12 men; Hunt road, 15 men; Island City project, eight men; La Grande schools, 10 men; La Grande school athletic field, 12 men. An additional 139 men went to work this morning or were called to go to work tomorrow morning. Previously to today, 168 men were at work and last Saturday's payroll amounted to nearly \$2700.

It was reported by committeemen that some of those going to work this week had been without employment for as long as two years. First call, of course, was given to those actually on the county relief rolls, with sec-
