WHY PENALIZE THE PUBLIC WORKER?

John Doe works for the city, the county, the school district — it doesn't make any difference which — and he puts in long hours.

That's one picture, and it shouldn't be particularly pleasing in this land of plenty, supposed to be the wealthiest in the world, and this and that.

John Doe has to have cash to pay some of his bills, so he has to sell the warrant. And lots of times he has to take a four per cent discount.

So there we have the picture of some one with ready money available making ten per cent on the public worker, and not lifting a hand in work.

In this state, eight per cent is considered pretty fair interest for loans — a fair return to the man who invests his money, and a fair price to pay by the man who has to seek financial assistance.

Now, a movement has been started in some sections to pay John Doe all but two per cent of the face of his warrant.

That seems a better way to handle the situation. Two per cent discount on paper that's paying six per cent interest — isn't that more sporting to the poor devil who makes such an investment possible by the sweat of his brow?

If you want to keep on the "good side" of Colonel Ralph Huron and his post office staff, remember to segregate the "town" cards from the "out-of-town" cards you mail during the Christmas season.
