Broiled Beef Sandwich
6 slices bread
Butter
1 lb. ground raw beef
Salt and pepper

Toast bread on one side. Butter the untoasted side, spread to the edge with a layer of the ground beef, dot with more butter, and broil rather low under the flame for about 5 minutes. Season with salt and pepper and serve at once. A slice of onion may decorate the top if desired.
