## DEATH CUTS WIDE SWATH IN SPOTS DURING THE YEAR

CHICAGO (AP)—Death cut wide and unforgettable swaths thru the ranks of America's sports stars in 1933, a year of athletic glory and tragedy. Hardly a sport escaped the inevitable toll, but boxing and baseball suffered the greatest loss.

In the world of baseball, one of the most prominent leaders perished with the death of Phil B. Kessel, owner of the St. Louis Browns, and William L. Vee who was promoted from the press at Wrigley Field, where he wrote critical stories, to the presidency of the Cubs.

Two old stars of the pugilist Glasgow of White Sox and Leticia fame, and Mike Donlin of Glenside back in 1904 to '10, succumbed to death and were joined by Rocky Finn, infield star of the Phillies who was cut down in his prime.

Boxing was shaken by two its darkest tragedies. Ernie Solis, the "Strong Boy of Boston," no recovered consciousness after had been beaten to the canvas by the big fists of Primo Carners.

William L. ("Young") King, one of boxing's cleanest and best, was killed while enjoying a motorcycle ride. Death also removed one of the greatest forces of box in William Muldoon, the "Soldier," and Gentleman Jim Corbett, introduced skill to a sport once considered solely by might and power.

Horse racing lost two of its greatest jockeys through accidental deaths—Buddy Hanford, who was killed while rushing his mount down a stretch of Pimlico, and ne-
