

### GREAT ELK HERD EVADES HUNTERS; NOW FACES DEATH

JACKSON, Wyo. (AP) — Starvation is menacing the Jackson Hole elk herd, the largest in the world. Game wardens and old settlers of the region south of Yellowstone park fear a repetition of tragic scenes during hard winters when thousands of the animals died.

The very mildness of last autumn is what threatens the elk this time. There was no early snow on the higher ranges and they remained in regions inaccessible to hunters while the open season was on. Shooters failed to get at them for the usual thinning of the herds which the Wyoming game and fish commission depends upon each year to prevent overproduction.

The state legislature extended the open season until January 1 in an effort to allow more hunters to get their game. The dry summer and fall depleted feeding grounds which ordinarily provide forage for thousands of the wapiti and the supply of hay grown and stored by the United States biological survey farm just outside of Jackson will be inadequate to keep alive the thousands expected to come into the valley later in the winter. The hay is produced expressly for the elk.

Estimates place the number of elk in the Jackson Hole and surrounding country this winter at 25,000 to 28,000.

### Expenditures In U. S. Today Pass 3 Billion Mark

WASHINGTON, Jan. 11 (AP) — Federal expenditures for the fiscal year today passed the \$3,000,000,000 mark, leaving \$8,000,000,000 to be spent before June 30 to fulfill President Roosevelt's budget estimates.

Budget estimates put total government outlays for 1934 at \$11,000,000,000. Exact cash expenditures so far as reported today by the treasury for January 9, the latest figures available, are \$3,006,128,537.

Nearly half the estimates for routine government costs has been spent. The exact figure is \$1,564,067,210, but of the more than \$7,000,000,000 which the president estimated for recovery costs, only \$1,452,061,320 has been used.

### "Pocket Pieces" Of Aluminum Are Made By U. P. Co.

One million aluminum lucky pocket pieces, in the form of coins, have been made by the Union Pacific railroad to present to individuals, firms and organizations throughout the country to commemorate the completion of the new streamlined U. P. passenger train.

First of these pieces were sent to American editors and the Observer received its "aluminum coin" yesterday. More will be given to school children and to visitors to the train on a forthcoming exhibition tour. It took five tons of aluminum to make the lucky pieces.

They are about the size of a half dollar, with a picture of the train on one side, with the words "Union Pacific Lucky Piece."

The company may expend the money, but if it does so it must be charged against the stockholders' fund which includes surplus.

When the salary slash was ordered by Thomas in the case of the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph company, that utility brought action in federal court for a temporary injunction, an interlocutory injunction and a final decree adjusting the order illegal and void, on the contention the law is unconstitutional. Federal Judge James Alger Fee granted a temporary restraining order and said the hearing on the application for an interlocutory judgment would be heard by the senior circuit judge at San Francisco.

J. H. Van Winkle, attorney general for Oregon, has refused to comment on the constitutionality of the act.

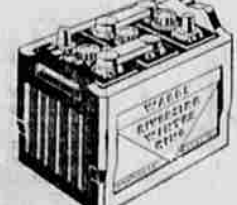
