FARMER GETS 40 PCT. OF RETAIL PRICE OF CREAM

PORTLAND, Jan. 11 (AP)—The dairy farmer serving Multnomah county will receive 40 per cent of the retail price of cream he produces on his ranch, on the basis of new prices announced after a night meeting of the Oregon milk control board here.

Although the farmer gets more actual cash, he receives a smaller percentage of the retail cream price under the latest price schedule issued by the board than he did in July, 1933.

The middleman and retailer benefit to a greater extent, it was said here by those who have studied the comparative figures.

Under the board's new ruling, 100 pounds of 22 per cent cream is sold by the farmer for \$3.46, and is bottled for retail sale at \$3.92 in half-pint bottles. On July 1, 1933, the farmer sold the cream for \$3.25, and it was sold at retail for \$3.10. The farmer's share being 43 per cent of the retail price.

It was said that under the original price schedule announced last Saturday the percentage the dairyman receives of the consumer's dollar would have been less than under the revised schedule.

FLORIDAN QUILTS AS ISLAND CHIEF

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12 (AP)—President Roosevelt today nominated General Blanton Winship, former judge advocate general of the army, as governor of Puerto Rico, succeeding Robert H. Gore of Florida, who resigned this morning.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12 (AP)—Robert H. Gore of Florida today resigned as governor of Puerto Rico.

President Roosevelt accepted the resignation of the newspaper publisher, who attributed ill health as the reason for giving up the post. He is in this country now.

Early appointment of a successor is expected. There also is strong likelihood that Gore, who played a part in the Roosevelt election campaign, will be given another assignment.

Gore was the center of a political quarrel in the island almost from the time he took office last summer. More than a month ago he and his family returned to the United States.

Mrs. Warner originally planned to open her classes earlier but was unable to do so.

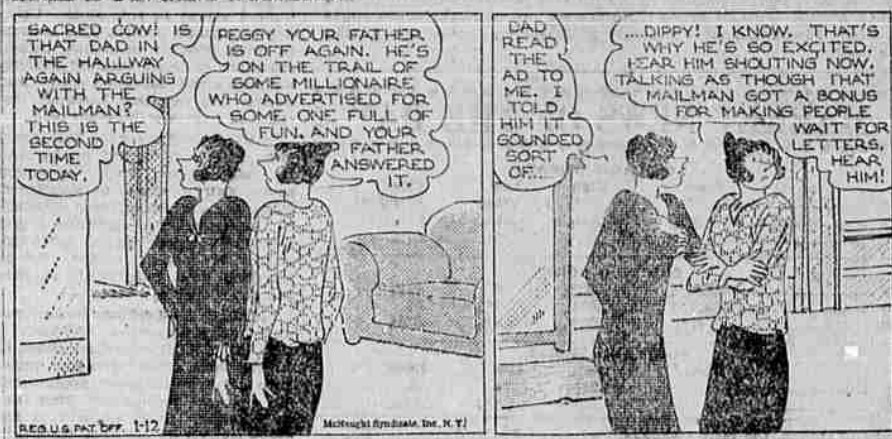
BOOK TRANSLATED FOR RUSSIA

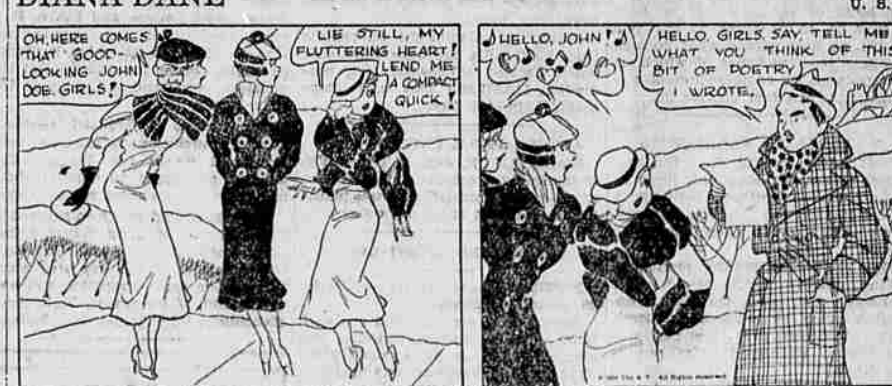

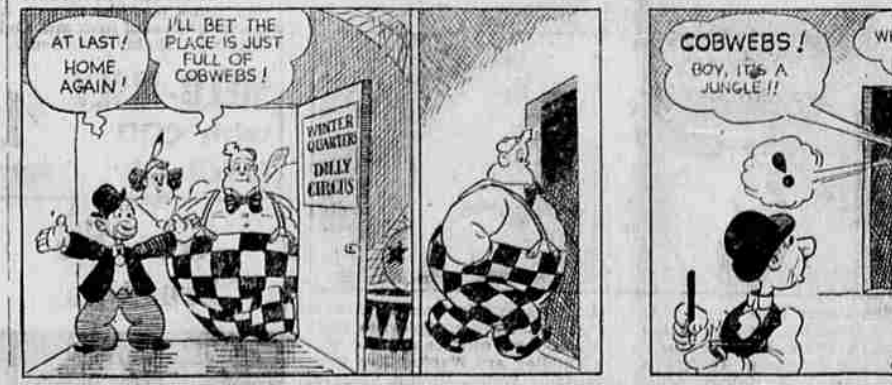
