LA GRANDE WILL SEE 'BUZZ' BROWN DO STUFF FRIDAY

When Elmer "Buzz" Brown steps into the ring here Friday night in the headline event of a boxing card at the Saeajawa arena, he will carry with him a record of 25 consecutive victories. The Portland flash, hailed as one of the greatest young featherweights to be developed in the boxing game for many years, won his 25th straight battle Jan. 9, defeating the hard-hitting, southpaw Filipino boy, Ross Dumaguille.

Brown has yet to meet with defeat or even held to a draw, and has been both lightweight and featherweights throughout the northwest. Facing him will be Jackie Brighton, of Seattle, a veteran of four years in the boxing game during which time he has had some half a hundred fights. Among his best fights was a close decision over Able Israel, and a draw with Joe Calder, sensational Filipino.

While fight fans expect Brown to be superior to Brighton in boxing ability, the Seattle boy is conceded by many to be the harder and better puncher.

A semi-final of six rounds and some four-round preliminary fights are being arranged for by Leo McCarthy and Martin Fitzgerald, promoters.

The close was strong. Transfers approximated 3,900,000 shares.
