

### HUSKIES DEFEAT COUGAR TEAM IN PULLMAN 30-28

PULLMAN, Wash., Jan. 16 (AP) — The University of Washington, lone undefeated team in the northern division, ran its victory string to five here last night, eking out a thrillsome 30-28 win over Washington state college in the first overtime game of the conference hoop season. The Cougars overcame a five-point lead to finish the first half in a 13-3 tie, and in the final session, the Huskies duplicated the feat by overcoming a like margin to pull up on even terms at 26-all. Just two seconds before the final gun Clyde Wagner, Husky center, was given a chance to put the game on ice with a free throw, but his try went wide, and the same went into an overtime period. Wagner made up for his miss by popping in a backward goal in the extra session, and Captain Hal Lee clinched it with a pair of free tosses. Nearly 4,000 fans saw the contest, the first of a two-game series. The second will be played on the same floor tonight.

### Beavers to Open Season in 1935 in New Stadium

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 16 (AP) — Thomas L. Turner, owner of the Portland club of the Pacific coast baseball league, announced Monday the Portland team will open the 1935 season in a new ball park with stands of steel and concrete. The new park and stadium will be built here by Ralph B. Lloyd, Los Angeles capitalist. Turner told the chamber of commerce members, forum luncheon. The site of the new park has not been selected. Plans for the new stadium are in hand, H. R. Drinker, Lloyd's Portland representative, said. The Portland Beavers will train this season at Ventura, Cal., Turner said, where Lloyd has large oil interests.

### Bell Resigns As Coach at Benson

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 16 (AP) — Clarence (Buster) Bell, ex-Oregon State fullback, has resigned as Benson Tech football coach and will continue as instructor in physical education. His successor will probably be Vernon (Skippy) Stivers, ex-Idaho quarterback who was Bell's assistant last season.

### QUINN PREPARES E. O. N. TEAM FOR NAMPA TOURNNEY

With acceptances received from all six schools invited to participate in the basketball tournament to be held at the Northwest Nazarene college gymnasium at Nampa January 19 and 20, drawings were to be made the first of this week. Loren H. Baader, College of Idaho coach who is promoting the tourney, has announced. Six teams entered include Albion Normal school, Gooding college, Boise Junior College, Eastern Oregon Normal school, Northwest Nazarene college and the College of Idaho. Coach Bob Quinn will take a comparatively untried team to represent E. O. N. In the first game, with just three days of practice, the Mountaineers were defeated by Boise Junior college 47 to 24.

Three more games, all last weekend, prepared the Eastern Oregon Normal school team for its entrance into the tournament. The Mountaineers lost to Whitman college Thursday night, and to Lewiston Normal school Friday and Saturday. The Mountaineer squad is composed almost entirely of freshmen. There isn't one single regular from last year's team and only three last year's substitutes. Only one of those, Worthley, is a regular this year and he is playing his first year as a regular member of the varsity.

The other two men from last year's squad are Halvorsen, sub-center, and Richards, sub-guard. Other men on the squads, all freshmen, include Peterson, Beers, Conklin, Crawford, Baxter, McCully, Ragsdale and Woodell. "Although my team lacks experience," Coach Quinn says, "the boys are aggressive and will improve very fast. We expect to give any team a run for its money in the tournament."

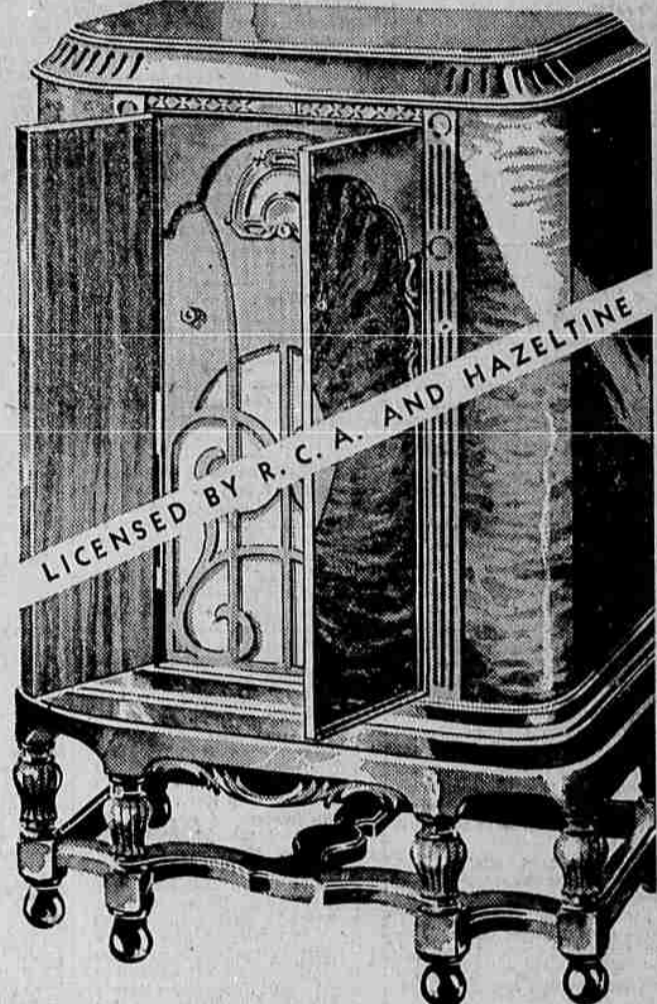
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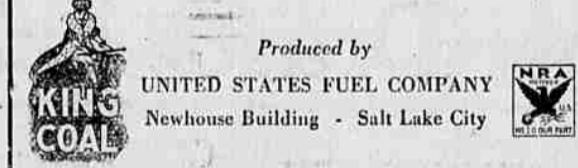
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
