BOSTON, Jan. 16 (AP) — Youth triumphed over skill, and Ellsworth Vines stood even today with the veteran Bill Tilden in their professional tennis series.

Each had two matches to his credit as the west coast youngster and the old master traveled to Providence, R. I., for their next appearance.

A crowd of 11,500, the largest tennis gathering in New England's history, saw them fight it out last night at the Boston garden.

John Jacobs, leader of the women's national title, was one of the spectators.

"Vines ran Tilden ragged," was her comment. "Ellie is at the top of his game. I never saw him play better tennis."

Tilden took the first two matches of the series in New York and Philadelphia. Vines captured the third in Washington and the fourth last night here.

No change in temperature and unsettled weather was predicted for tonight and tomorrow by the Oregon Bureau.

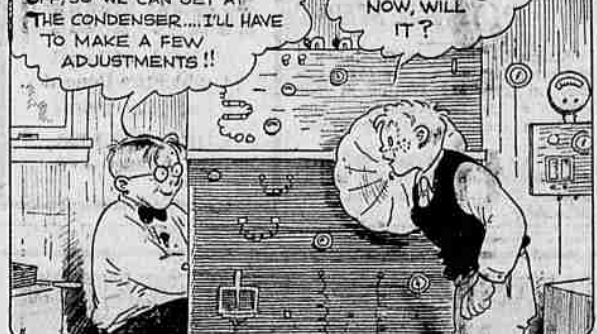
PADEREWSKI'S WIFE DIES

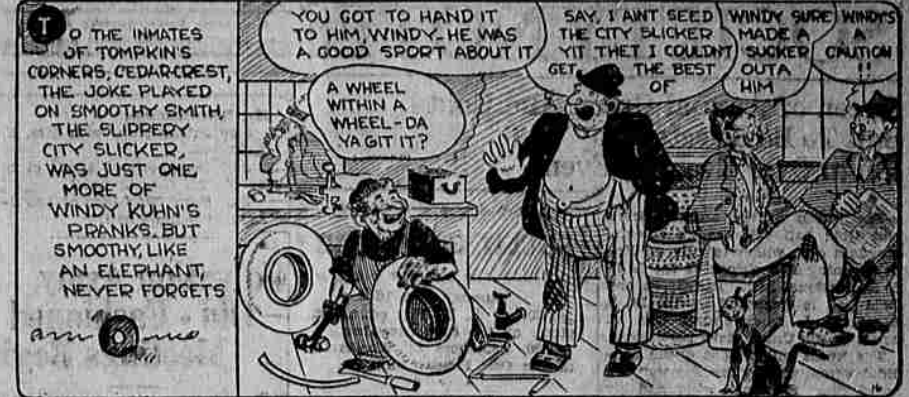
