BIG SUPPLY BILL PASSED BY HOUSE

WASHINGTON, Jan. 20 (AP)—The second regular annual appropriation bill, carrying \$31,128,504 for the interior department for the 1935 fiscal year, was passed Friday by the house and sent to the senate.

The bill is \$19,350,000 less than expenditures allowed this year and \$100,000 below budget estimates.

It provides \$10,269,000 for the Indian service in addition to \$1,414,000 out of tribal funds; \$800,000 for the reclamation service; \$9,319,000 for the geological survey; \$9,319,000 for the national parks; and \$1,252,000 for the education office.
