## State Highway To Employ Many Men This Year

PORTLAND, Jan. 23 (AP)—At the peak of state highway construction this year, work will be given to 12,000 men, directly on the jobs, and as many more will be employed indirectly as a result of the highway construction, it was said here Monday by Leslie M. Scott, chairman of the state highway commission.

Scott said employment over a nine-month period will average 15,000 persons, half of whom will be actually on new road jobs.

Of the \$20,000,000 federal and state road money to be spent during the year, two-thirds will be spent in Western Oregon, and one-third in Eastern Oregon, Scott said.
