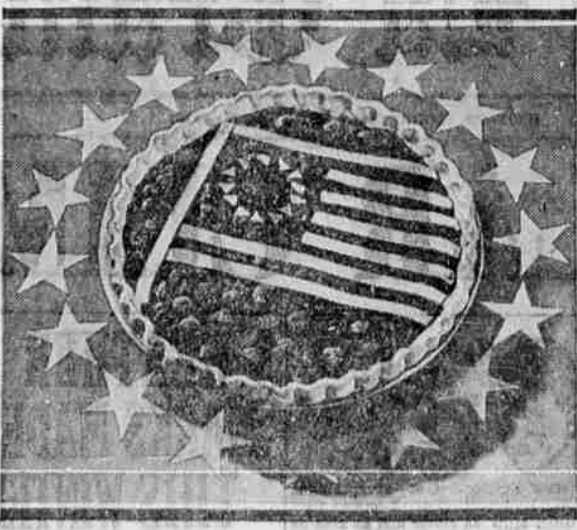

### This Novel Mince Meat-Cherry Pie Provides Patriotic Flavor



IF YOU'RE celebrating a patriotic holiday, here's a novel short-cut to dessert distinction. You can make this new recipe for cherry-mince meat pie in less than an hour. Drain the juice from a number 2 can of sour cherries and add enough water to make 2 1/2 cups. Bring to a boiling point. Pour on a 9 ounce package of dry condensed mince meat and boil 20 minutes, stirring occasionally. Cool before using.

Blend the drained sour cherries and the cooled mince meat. Roll pie crust and place in pie tin. Pour in mixture. Cut one-half inch strips of pastry and lay across pie to suggest outline of a flag in George Washington's day. Bake in a hot oven (400 degrees F.) about 35 minutes. Makes one pie. Make the mince meat cherry pie your table centerpiece. Surround it by gold stars to suggest the other states of the union, or by tiny flags.

### DEVALUATION SEES GAIN IN COMMODITIES

attributed to an active movement of funds to New York from abroad. As soon as New York banks began to buy gold, this premium was expected to vanish.

Reckoned on the new gold value of the dollar, the world supply of monetary gold has jumped from some \$20,000,000,000. The United States monetary gold supply becomes about \$6,800,000,000 in contrast to roughly \$4,030,000,000 on the basis of the old dollar. American gold remains about one-third of the total world supply.

In Washington the United States was described today by Secretary Morgenthau as being on a "1934 model of a gold bullion standard" as a result of the dollar devaluation program which netted the government a \$2,792,940,817 profit.

He made this statement to reporters as Professor Irving Fisher, of Yale, testified to a house banking subcommittee that the existing federal reserve system "will now be lucky if it escapes destruction altogether."

Fisher urged creation of a federal monetary authority with sole currency issuing power.

Morgenthau refused to discuss operation of the \$2,000,000,000 stabilization fund created out of the devaluation profits, its use is to be kept strictly secret.

In other administration quarters, it was said that in its monetary actions, the United States wanted the whole world to go along and share in any recovery which might develop.
