

PLAN MILK POOL FOR WEST AREA

PORTLAND, Feb. 8 (AP)—Establishment of a pooling agency by which milk and cream surpluses in the Portland milkshed may be controlled and the industry otherwise stabilized, may be effected by Saturday, it was said here today by E. G. Harlan, chairman of the Oregon milk control board.

Next week the control board will visit Baker, La Grande, Pendleton and other Eastern Oregon cities where meetings will be held, data collected, and suggestions heard for ultimate formulation of price schedules and milkshed boundaries.

minor rioting was renewed on the boulevards.

Police charged demonstrators who gathered around the Madeleine church and several crowds of hoodlums gathered in the Place de la Concorde, but clashes did not immediately occur.

Of the more than 1000 rioters arrested in the two days of disorders in Paris, 58 were tried today. Nine were sent to jail for terms of eight days to three months—the charge: "Kiloway breaking and hitting rival demonstrators."

"The other 49 were released, as well as the rest of those arrested."

BREMER SAFE; RANSOM PAID TO KIDNAPERS

Adolph Bremer issued a statement expressing his happiness over his son's return and thanking friends and the president and Governor Floyd B. Olson for their interest while the banker was held captive.

"The hideous hours of suspense have been almost unbearable for all of us," said the elder Bremer.

A possible clue to the gang was given by Douglas Street, 33, chauffeur for Dr. Walmann Walters, Mayo clinic physician at Rochester, Street said he saw two well dressed men in an automobile bearing a New York license at Lewiston, Minn., about 3 a. m., today. Lewiston is 37 miles east of Rochester.

Walter Mauge, wealthy contractor friend of the family, was the intermediary who delivered the ransom. Full details of the delivery were not disclosed.

In view of the family's earlier statements, that they were ready and eager to pay the full ransom the view was taken in some quarters that the entire \$200,000 was turned over to the captors.

Howard McGonn and Mrs. Jennie Haight, employees in the bus depot at Rochester, were believed to have been the first persons to see the banker after his release.

He entered the depot, they said, about 8 p. m., yesterday, asking about bus connections with the Twin Cities. They told him he had missed the last bus that night to the Twin Cities but that he could take a train to Owatonna, nearby, and catch a bus there.

Bremer was quoted as saying he couldn't do that. McGonn and Mrs. Haight paid no particular attention to the unshaven stranger, who appeared dazed, they said, and did not know he was the long sought St. Paul banker.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 8 (AP)—Department of justice officials indicated today that the search for the abductors of Edward G. Bremer, wealthy St. Paul banker, would be intensified now that he has been returned alive.

dar year 1933.

The committee also continued the three cent interest postage rate on first class mail but adopted an amendment which permits the rates on second class matter affecting newspapers, magazines and advertising matter to revert to the rates in effect prior to the 1932 revenue bill.

In addition the committee approved a provision giving the president power to reduce the three cent rate on first class mail to two cents if the condition of the treasury justifies it.

The three cent rate was continued for only one year. Under existing law it would expire July 1.
