In Washington

WASHINGTON—With the value of the American dollar now definitely fixed at 49.06 cents in gold, Washington officials and observers are asking what is to be the next step.

Is stabilization near at hand? Does a world monetary conference, having for its purpose an effort to bring back stable conditions in the realm of finance, thereby serving as a signal for better business everywhere, appear close at hand?

One's guess apparently is as good as another's.

Some high government officials think so. They believe that revaluation of the dollar brings world stabilization of currencies and a return to favor of a reformed international gold standard just another step nearer.

On the other hand, President Roosevelt has said he doesn't believe other countries are ready for stabilization.

Weapon For Trades
It is agreed generally, however, that President Roosevelt is now in possession of powerful weapons for bargaining with England, France and the other nations of the world.

The dollar revaluation act places a two billion dollar stabilization fund at the president's disposal. Every dollar of that two billion is backed by 13.96 grains of gold. More than that, he has leeway to change the value of the dollar between 11.61 grains and 13.96 grains of gold — or between 60 and 69 cents on the old dollar basis.

Monetary experts pointed to the fact that with the gold content of the dollar reduced from 23.22 grains to 13.96 grains it would be able to hold its own with any of the currencies of the world.

The British pound, for instance, in terms of gold is worth only 65 per cent as much as it was when England went off the gold standard; Scandinavian currencies only about 60 per cent of what they were when hatched to gold; the Canadian dollar only about 62 per cent of what it used to be.

Gold Coin Or Bullion?
Those nations still on the gold standard, like France, Switzerland and Holland, have a gold standard different from what the United States had prior to March 3, 1933.

The United States had a gold coin standard. These nations have a gold bullion standard. Up until last March an individual here could take his currency to the treasury and exchange it for gold coin.

In France the cheapest gold he can get is a gold bar worth thousands of dollars and scores of thousands of francs.

America now is on an international gold bullion standard. If the major countries of the world get together and decide what the value of their currencies shall be in terms of gold, the United States probably would change to a similar gold bullion standard.

Ques.: What is known as "Dark Ages"?
Ans.: The name given to a period in the history of the world, of about 700 years duration between A. D. 475 and 1137. It was so-called because it was overshadowed by the splendor of the Roman empire during the period immediately before, and by the wonderful culture and force of the revival of learning which followed.

stantial and steadily increasing attendance and has even in its brief existence fairly won an honorable place among the higher educational institutions of the great northwest and.

Whereas the citizens of La Grande in a generous and public spirited way and by an overwhelming majority voted bonds to aid in the construction of a training school to become a part of and to be used in connection with the Eastern Oregon Normal school and.

Whereas owing to the limited capacity of the present facilities the students are denied the maximum and scholarly efforts of the faculty of the school entitle them.

Now, therefore be it resolved, by the city commission of La Grande, in regular session assembled, that the immediate construction of the training school is a matter of the utmost urgency, that delay in its construction is a gross injustice to the people of Eastern Oregon as a whole and particularly to the students now attending or who now desire to attend the Eastern Oregon Normal and that the congressional delegation of this state be earnestly urged to render all possible aid in procuring prompt and favorable action by the public works administrator on the application heretofore made for funds with which to construct such training school.
