PARIS (AP) — Divided skirts are the latest note in sports clothes.
Golf clothes, skating skirts and other costumes ready for practical sports wear appear with bifurcated skirts. Some of them may be buttoned and re-buttoned to make either a trouser-like model for active sports wear or a simple little skirt for the street.
Most of them are from 10 to 12 inches from the ground.
Blouses Give Bright Note
Vivianet shows in her latest collections trim sports suits designed with tailored divided skirts. One combines a jacket and bifurcated skirt of light brown wool with a pink jersey blouse; the other unites a dark brown wool suit with an orange blouse.
