ALDRICH NOT TO RUN

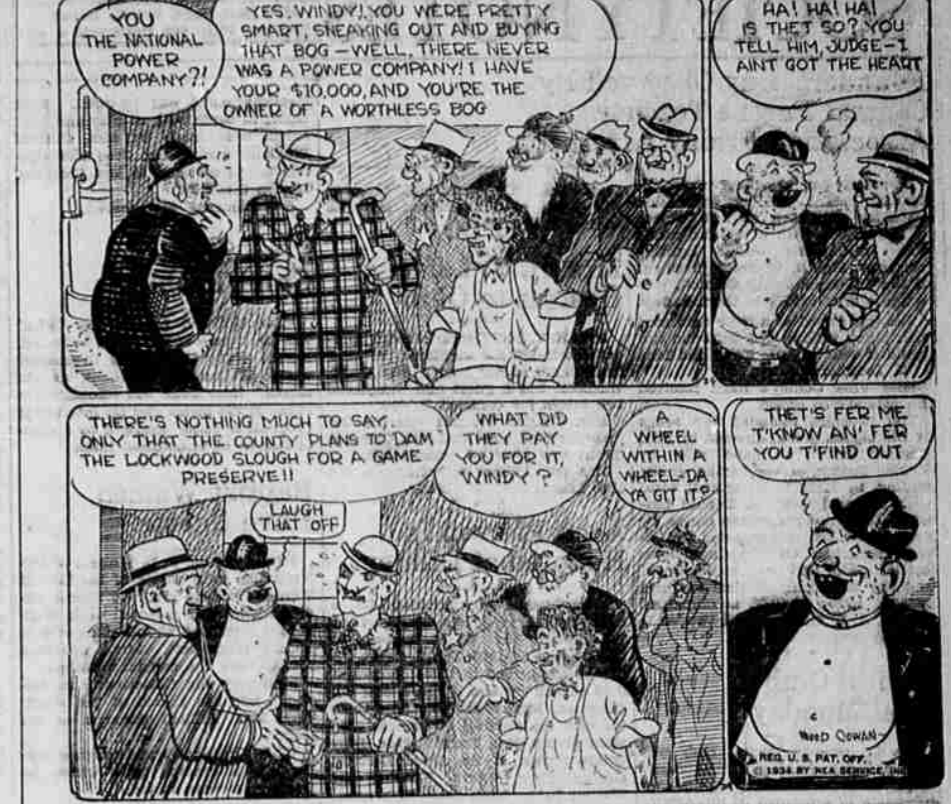

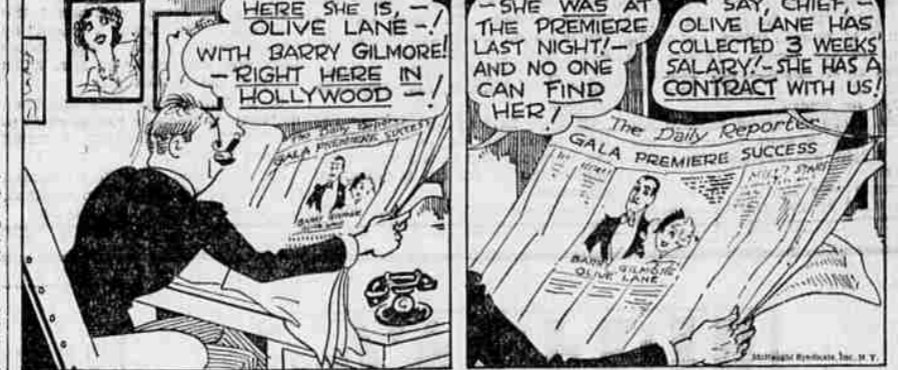

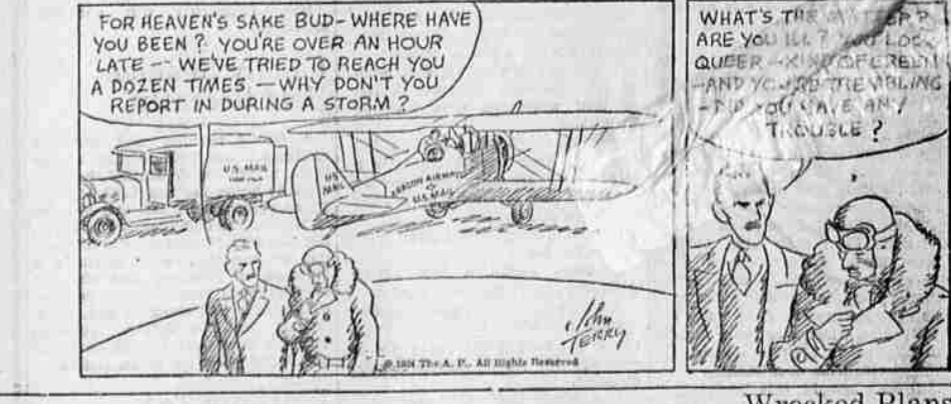
