

F. R. AUTHORIZES LAND PURCHASES

WASHINGTON, Feb. 28 (AP)—President Roosevelt has given the signal for immediate governmental purchases of submarginal land to withdraw it from production considered unprofitable.

Secretary Wallace, after a White House conference, looked for quick action on this \$25,000,000 program.

Between 3,000,000 and 5,000,000 acres will be purchased, he said, the main problem being to "conserve the human interest."

The president delegated Harry L. Hopkins, federal relief administrator, to find places for the people whose lands will be thus retired from production.

WILL RETURN TO LA GRANDE TO MAKE HOME

The delegation was concerned lest the allotments for the Bonneville dam would militate against further expenditure in Oregon.

PORTLAND, Feb. 28 (AP)—The Oregon PWA advisory board had disbanded today as the national recovery administration moved upon the next course of its program.

The group disbanded after a final meeting here late Wednesday in which 91 loan applications totaling \$19,385,400 were sent to Washington, D. C., from Oregon for the approval of the administration, including a project for the Enterprise water supply, \$10,000.

C. C. Hockley, state PWA engineer, who with Marshall N. Dana, regional advisor, will be retained in the Portland office, may later present several incomplete applications.

The largest application forwarded Wednesday was an item totaling \$9,200,000 for the Portland sewer district.

Other large proposals included \$3,313,000 for the Bear creek dam to supply power for Portland; \$2,892,917 for a city-county-state building in Portland; \$1,065,787 for a municipal airport in Portland, and \$648,978 for a berth for the battleship Oregon.

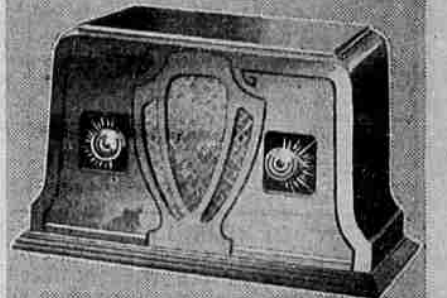

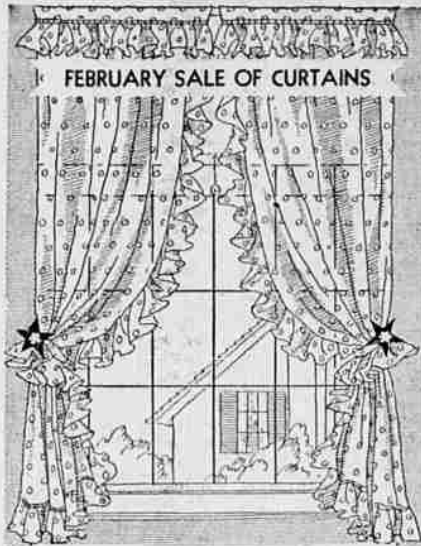

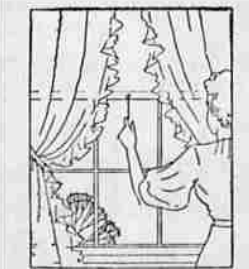
