LINDBERGH BOOK QUITE PROPHETIC

PHILADELPHIA, March 2 (AP)—The late Charles A. Lindbergh Sr., Minnesota congressman and father of the famous flier, speaks today through a book which was suppressed by the government during the World war. Entitled "Your Country at War," the elder Lindbergh's work is described by the publishers who brought it out today as prophetic. In its attacks on war-time hysteria, profiteers, bankers and giant monopolies, the volume makes predictions and recommendations which have materialized in the years since the representative's death in 1924.

"The book even predicts use of a plan almost identical with the NIA," says an introduction by the author's former law partner, W. E. Quigley, of Minneapolis. "The Pecora investigations of big bankers and high finance are revealing things in 1933 and 1934 that were foretold by Lindbergh in 1917."

FILE SALES TAX PETITIONS SOON

PORTLAND, Mar. 3 (AP)—Sponsors of the referendum on the state sales tax said today they had "upwards of 17,000 signatures" on petitions, and that the referendum would be filed with the secretary of state next Wednesday. The law requires that no less than 16,666 valid signatures must be affixed to the petitions.

New York U. Signs Stevens as Coach

NEW YORK, Mar. 3 (AP)—New York university has turned to Dr. Marvin A. (Mal) Stevens to lead the Violets out of the football wilderness. The 34-year-old veteran of 10 years' coaching experience at Yale was named head football coach at N. Y. U. by the board of athletic control last night. He signed a one-year contract calling for a salary believed to be around \$7500.

AG. SUPPLY BILL PASSED BY HOUSE

WASHINGTON, Mar. 3 (AP)—The house late Friday passed the \$2,000,000 agriculture department supply bill, including \$2,000,000 for federal participation in grasshopper control in several mid-western states. This compared with \$201,109.091 for the present fiscal year. Among the decreases was one of \$27,000,000 for the bureau of public roads, which received only \$8,000,000. The bill now goes to the senate.
