

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS CLUBS MEET IN TACOMA

TACOMA, Wash. (Special)—A conference of the International Relations clubs in the northwest region will take place here March 16 and 17 under the auspices of the College of Puget Sound.

Plans for the conference were announced by the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace. The leading speakers will be Sir Herbert Ames, former member of the dominion parliament, and Miss Andy Hemmway Jones, division assistant of the division of intercourse and education of the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace.

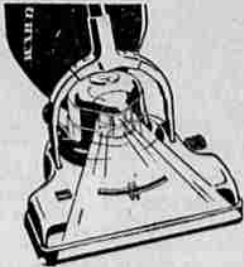
