CITY ACT IS IN ADDITION TO KNOX LAW

(Continued From Page One) liquor is sold, prohibited sale of liquor to anyone under 21 years of age, made it unlawful to sell liquor within 500 feet of any public school or normal school, prohibited sale of liquor in lodging or rooming houses (this does not apply to hotels), and made it unlawful to drink on the streets, in alleys, or any public place other than allowed by the state law. The ordinance also provided that all state-licensed liquor selling places should consist of but one room, have an unobstructed view of the interior from the street, and booths must not be more than 42 inches in height from the floor. Archedways were not construed to be partitions. Violations of the city ordinance are punishable by a maximum fine of \$300 or 90 days in jail or both, and in addition the city reserves the right to declare certain places common nuisances if disorder is allowed. Acts On Applications In connection with the state law, which provides that cities must endorse applications for sale of wines and beer by private persons, the city endorsed an application presented by the Saccaven arm, but held up action on one submitted by R. P. Leslie, of the Hebrau. The police chief reported approval of Mr. Leslie's application except as to the partition which was held as partially obstructing the view of the interior, and also objected to the height of booths, which are more than 42 inches. The upshot of the matter was that the commission referred the matter to the police chief and city recorder, with power to act as quickly as Mr. Leslie alters his place to conform with the city ordinance. Attorney Bureleigh represented Mr. Leslie at the session, making an earnest plea for immediate endorsement. The commission held to the attitude that each place must conform with city rulings before the commissioners would feel justified in endorsing their applications to the state. The commission approved the city salary list for the month of February in the amount of \$4,589.00, and the city manager's report revealed \$2,491.37 in warrants retired during the week.
