Practically all of the work the last several weeks was done under the civil works administration, costing the city only a minimum. When work was first started it was planned to build up only the northside approach at present, and part of this was accomplished before the C. W. A. help was enlisted. Then the city moved to build up both approaches, getting gravel from fifth street between M and N, and from M avenue between Sixth and Fifth, cutting both streets down to a point where they may be opened to travel sometime soon.

It was probably the most important city project completed during the last few years.

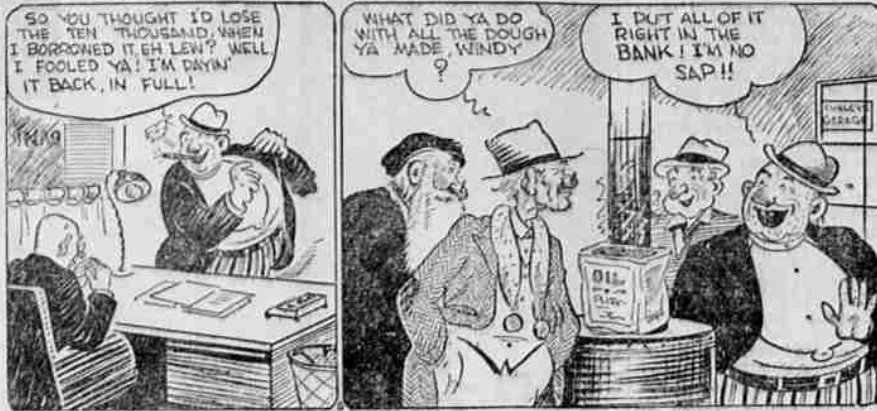

### AUTO ACCIDENTS KILL 29,900 IN THE LAST YEAR

Automobile accidents in 1933 totaling 756,300 resulted in the death of 29,900 persons and the injury of 850,700 in this country, thus bringing the total of deaths for the last four years up to nearly 126,000 and the number of persons injured non-fatally up to around 4,000,000, according to statistics obtained by the Travelers Insurance Co. and given to the company's local agent, Oscar Warnock.

The record of fatalities for the last year was 2.5 per cent greater than in 1932, but on the per cent basis the deaths increased 5.9 per cent and the number of persons injured non-fatally 2.2 per cent.

Collisions between automobiles caused 339,440 accidents, 7,150 fatalities and injuries to 494,110. Pedestrians were involved in 280,900 accidents, in which 13,440 were killed and 292,270 injured. Collisions of automobiles with fixed objects caused 46,370 accidents, resulting in 3,140 fatalities and injuries to 50,740 persons.

Accidents of the non-collision type totaled 41,910, causing 3,570 deaths and injuries to 50,450 persons. Collisions with street cars caused 10,420 accidents, resulting in 290 fatalities and injuries to 10,500 persons. The other major accident group was collision of automobiles, with bicycles, causing 16,720 accidents, 420 deaths and 15,910 injuries.

Exceeding the speed limit caused the most accidents, 129,030 in number, which resulted in 5,640 deaths and injuries to 143,930 persons. Not having the right of way caused 118,400 accidents, which resulted in 2,320 deaths and 143,650 injuries. Driving on the wrong side of the road caused 61,270 accidents in which 2,270 were killed and 71,720 injured. Driving off the roadway was another major accident cause, resulting in 58,900 accidents which killed 3,280 and injured 53,240.

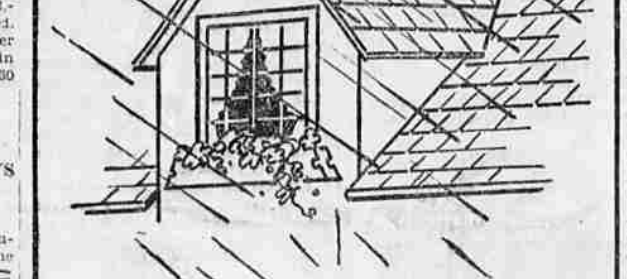
