NEW YORK, Mar. 13 (AP)—A Chicago dispatch to Dow, Jones & Co., says it is understood Montgomery Ward & Co. will probably show net income of between \$2,000,000 and \$3,000,000 for the year ended Jan. 31. This would be the company's first net income since 1930 when profit totaled \$423,211.

PRICE ON — Markets MG PORTLAND, Mar. 13 (AP)—Once again the price on extras was attacked during the produce exchange session with a resulting loss of 1/2c lb. which brings this quotation to 23 1/2c lb., exactly the same as standards and prime firsts. Firsts are unchanged at 22 1/2c. Butterfat was unchanged generally.

Post eggs were flitting all sorts of prices on the local market. Bejects from extras were chiefly offered at the moment on the bargain counter inasmuch as real quality was flitting bids higher than resale value.

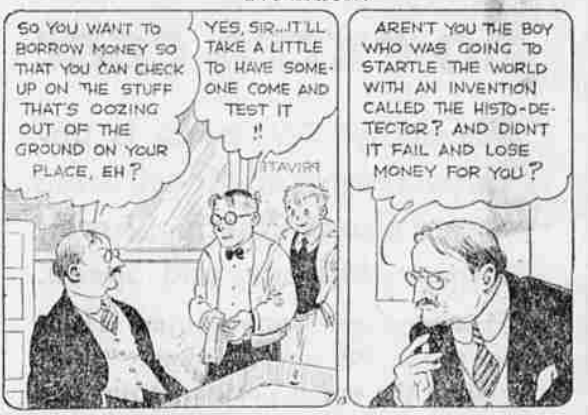

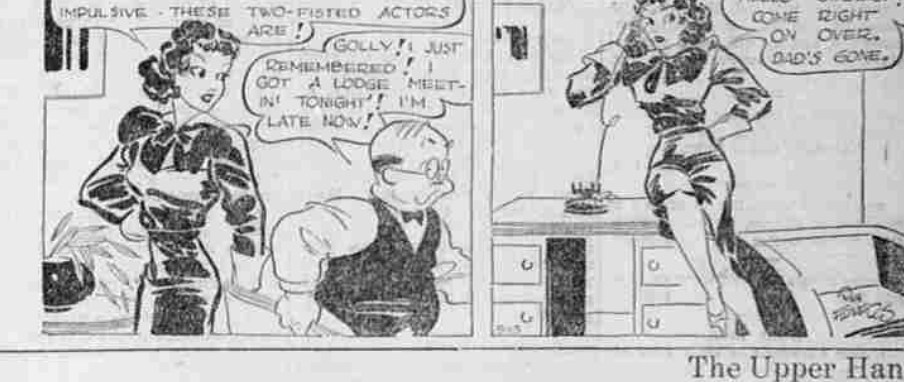
