For Lent
 Be still and know that I am God. Ps. 46-10.
 The Gospels teach us the value of times of solitude. We read that the Savior sometimes withdrew Himself from the crowds of people who thronged around Him, and went into a desert place apart to pray. We read also that He said to His disciples, "Come ye yourselves apart into a desert place and rest awhile." He was teaching them the value of solitude, because in solitude they could find moments for communing with God. There is another interesting instance of solitude recorded in the New Testament. The apostle Paul tells us that after his conversion he went not to the busy throngs in Jerusalem, but to Arabia. He went to a place where he could be quiet and meditate for a little while.

One of the things the Christian has to learn is the value of being alone with the Lord for a little while each day. To spend a little time in prayer, or in the reading of the Word, is to learn how to renew one's spiritual strength.
 Intervals of spiritual solitude are necessary to the growing soul. In the quiet moments we can hear the Lord speaking to us. This is what the Lord meant when He said, "Pray to Father who is in secret, and thy Father who seeth in secret shall reward thee openly."
 Most people would rather dance than pray. They would rather visit a picture-house than read a chapter of the Bible. They would do almost anything rather than spend ten minutes alone with the Lord.
 Earthly pleasures are not wrong; action is not wrong; but before them all we should learn to know the value of quiet communion with God.

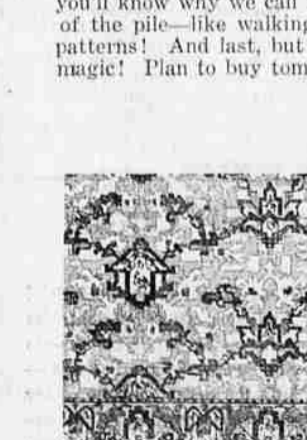

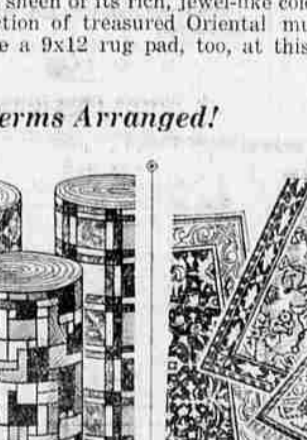

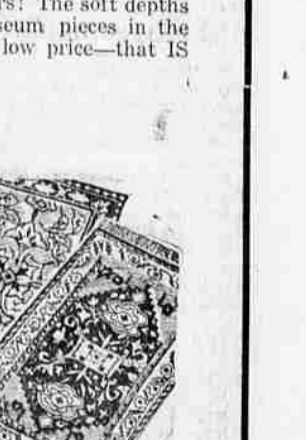
