YIELDS ON LONG TERM BONDS HELD ON THE DECLINE

By Claude A. Jagger (Associated Press Financial Editor) NEW YORK, Mar. 17 (AP) — When so prominent an economist as John Maynard Keynes expresses the opinion that the course of yields on long-term bonds is downward, investment analysts sit up and take notice.

If this prognostication is correct, it means that gilt-edged bonds are still cheap, despite current high levels, and that the United States treasury will undoubtedly be able to refund its large floating debt on decidedly satisfactory terms.

Keynes recently expressed this opinion at the meeting of the National Mutual Life Insurance Co., of which he is chairman, in London. He felt that yields on long-term bonds, both in the United States and England, were definitely declining.

Wall Street experts, however, are by no means unambiguously accepting Keynes' analysis, particularly as regards the United States. With gold reserves vastly expanded, and a huge credit base set up for future use, it is acknowledged that credit may well be cheap for some time to come.

On the other hand, continued cheap credit, it is pointed out, implies a balanced budget. Keynes' conclusion as regards the United States is evidently based on the belief that it will be possible over the next fiscal year to curtail governmental expenditures in this country, according to the schedule outlined in the president's budget message.

LAKE NEAR BERLIN SCENE OF 1934 OLYMPIC ROWING

BERLIN (AP) — The international rowing contests which will be held as part of the next Olympic games will be held August 7 to 15, 1936, on Gruenau lake, near Berlin.
