LIQUOR CONTROL COMMISSION TO TRY NEW SCHEME

PORTLAND, Mar. 17 (AP)—Another direct attack on the bootlegging industry has been agreed upon by the Oregon liquor control commission which has decided to keep one bottle store here open until midnight and to experiment with bonded messenger delivery.

If the plan works satisfactory in Portland it may be extended to stores in other parts of the state.

The action was taken after it had been explained that bootleggers, who are believed to sell 75 per cent of the liquor distributed in Portland, operate most actively at night when the call for hard liquor is at its height.

Alex. G. Barry, one of the three commissioners, agreed that "it is closing of state stores defeats its own purpose." "It shuts off the supply," he said, "just when it's most needed."

Other regulations adopted by the control board at its meeting here Friday included the provision that dance halls may serve beer in rooms separate from the dance floor. This was done as a step toward curbing bootlegging of hard liquor in the vicinity of dance halls.

No beer sign shall project from a building over the sidewalk, the commission decided. The question whether beer licenses may be granted to aliens and prohibition law violators has not yet been determined.

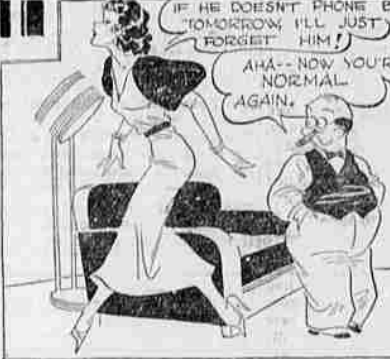

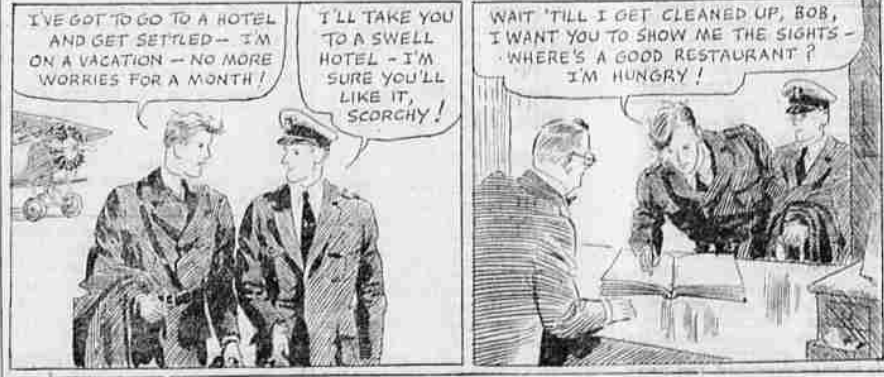
