## Van Winkle Gives Ruling On State Old Age Pensions

SALEM, Mar. 21 (AP)—The old age pension law provides that parents, children and brothers and sisters if able to do so must support indigent persons, and these persons if found with other possible support are not eligible for the pension. Attorney General I. H. Van Winkle ruled in an opinion handed Sherman S. Smith, district attorney of Josephine county. Under the civil law one exception is made to this rule, in the case of married females where the county has no legal right to compel them to support indigent parents "while their husbands live."

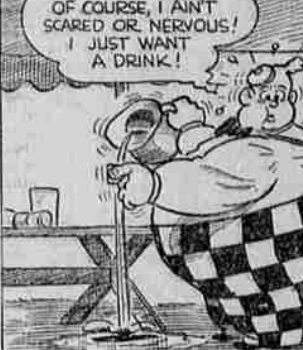
