

Martin Expects To Win; Pierce Not Predicting

WASHINGTON, Mar. 22 (AP)—Members of congress, without a doubt, are extremely busy participating in the ever-changing picture in which they are actors—some of them stars—but most of them find a few moments to discuss "back home" politics during the day.

Some are reluctant to make predictions, but others, like Representative Martin of Oregon, who is seeking the Democratic nomination as governor of his state, will forecast victory.

Marching—a person can't help marching when swinging along with the white-haired Oregonian, a retired major-general—through the subway from the capitol to the new hearing office building, Martin predicted "we have a good chance to make it a clean sweep next fall."

"But I may get the pants licked off of me," he mused as he reflected on the May and November elections.

On the other hand, Oregon's Republican, Mott, won't concede a thing as he seeks to return to his

seat in the lower house of congress. "The Democrats are going to make a real bid for all elective offices at home," he said.

Former Governor Pierce, Oregon's third representative in congress, is making no predictions and no promises, but he "can't see how Oregon could turn away from the administration."

Williams Enters Race for Governor

PORTLAND, Mar. 22 (AP)—Advocating the "banning of every form of gambling under a local plan, with strict regulation and heavy penalties for violation," Sam M. Williams, of Portland, has announced he is a candidate for the Democratic nomination as governor.

Williams, resident of Portland for 25 years, two years ago was the Democratic nominee for sheriff of Multnomah county.

Demonstration Sponsored By 3 Local Companies

A very successful tractor demonstration was held yesterday afternoon at the five-acre lot adjoining the city septic farm. A John Deere general purpose farm tractor was used equipped with Goodyear pneumatic farm tractor tires using the new Shell 27 plus diesel for fuel.

At the start of the demonstration the fuel was measured by City Manager Angus McAllister. The fuel was again checked at the end of the run and the results showed that the fuel consumption was less than two gallons per acre. This proved the economy of this type of equipment as the fuel cost was only 13c per acre.

Many of the farmers who attended the demonstration were impressed with the small amount of fuel used. They all agreed that the performance was remarkable because of the fact that many turns had to be made on the small lot which, according to them, is the cause of much fuel waste.

The demonstration was sponsored by Claude Wright Implement Co., Paland Sims Co. and Shell Oil Co.

Allen, formerly of Wallawa but now of H.E. Lake—where he has established his residence as a citizen of Union county, so seek the Republican nomination for Rep. Eckley's seat.

Mr. Allen, asked by an Observer reporter as to whether he would be a candidate, said that he had not reached a decision, although he said he had been approached by several in this connection. In the legislature, Mr. Allen represented both Union and Wallawa counties in his first term, and the second term just Wallawa county, so the districts were changed. He is at present a member of the Bonville down committee, and is chairman of the house ways and means committee. By virtue of the latter he also is a member of the state emergency board. Generally, the feeling is that Mr. Allen would make a very strong race in this county.
