discounts, trading stamps, rebates, untional extensions of credit, gratuities or free service of any nature shall in any way enter into the sale or purchase of milk or cream in Union county under this act.

The board gets its authority by the law providing that any milk dealer is required to operate under license granted by the board, and the term "milk dealer" means any person who purchases or handles milk. A producer who delivers milk only to a milk dealer shall not be deemed a "milk dealer," the law says.

Salem, defending champion, failed to enter the semi-finals for the first time since 1929 when Franklin, playing far better ball than when it noosed McMinnville by one point, took a spirited contest 35 to 28.

Klamath Falls had more difficulty in defeating Eugene 35 to 30 and there were but few points difference

The favorite Astorians were nearly upset by the fast aggregation from The Dalles the latter holding the fast-men scoreless in the fourth period and came within two points of tying up the tally. The game ended 22 to 20. Ashland High school previously were not pressed the least in winning from Coquille 45 to 23, and will meet Astoria in the other semi-final contest.

Beaverton — Mitchell — Jefferson, Fondleton and La Grande were eliminated yesterday from further play. Silvertown eliminated McMinnville from the state basketball tournament here today by a 43 to 14 score, earning the right to play Columbia Prep in the consolation finals. McMinnville failed to score in the first half. Columbia Prep won from Dallas 27 to 21, and also entered the finals of the consolation series.

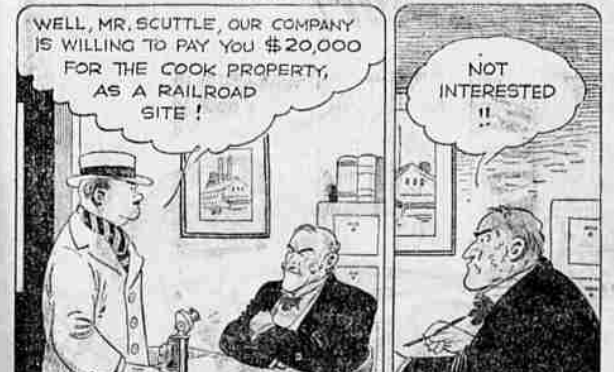
