APR. 1 DEADLINE ON BEER LICENSE

PORTLAND, Mar. 27 (AP)—All places selling beer must have their state licenses by April 1, it was announced by George L. Sammis, administrator of the state liquor control commission.

On that date, he said, the various law enforcement agencies will go into action against those who do not have the necessary permits.

Sammis said many applications are being filed at the Salem office without bonds, and the applicants therefore cannot qualify.

The administrator indicated the liquor control board will materially reduce the number of places selling beer in Portland and elsewhere in the state. The commission will act independently of city recommendations in passing on applicants.
