Thirty-two games have been played so far and the National, led by the Chicago Cubs, Pittsburgh Pirates and New York Giants, have won 20 of them. Of the 12 decisions that have gone to the American league's credit, the New York Yankees and St. Louis Browns have accounted for seven. Connie Mack's Philadelphia Athletics, like the Browns, have won three engagements from teams in John Heydler's loop, but likewise had dropped eight.
