## Sorosis Club Guests Of Mrs. Rechlin

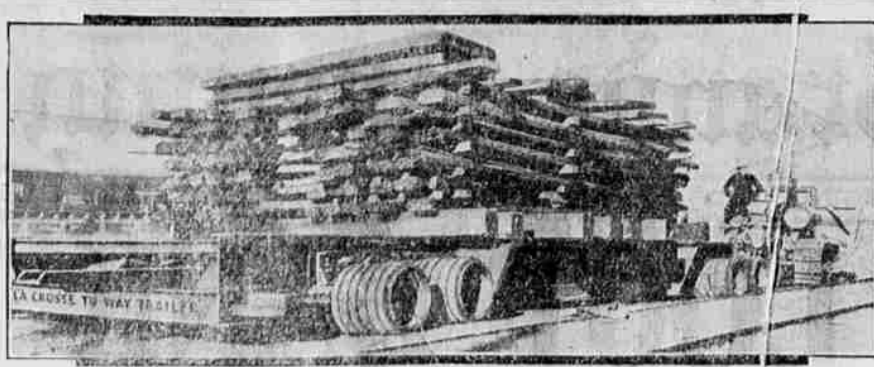

## DIFFICULT PROBLEM IS SOLVED



One of the most difficult transportation problems in connection with the construction of Boulder Dam has been solved by the use of the largest trailer ever built, cushioned on 32 solid rubber tires manufactured by the Goodyear Tire and Rubber Co. The gargantuan equipment weighs approximately 41 tons and is designed to carry a maximum payload of an additional 200 tons.

The trailer is used to haul sections of steel tubing, varying in diameter from eight and one-half feet to 30 feet, over a tortuous mountain road from the pipe fabrication plant to the dam site, a mile and a half below, where they are being assembled by The Six Companies, contractors for the dam project. Width of the trailer is 22 feet and its over-all length is more than 37 feet. It requires a turning radius of 100 feet but is so constructed that it can be towed from either end, thus eliminating the necessity of providing such a large turning area at each of the operating terminals. Large tractors provide the motive power. Each of the four corners of the gigantic trailer is supported by two axles, and on each end of each axle is a wheel with two 28x14 Goodyear solid tires. This provides 448 inches of tire width distributed over the 16 wheels. The normal capacity of each tire is 10,300 pounds which with an overload allowance of 25 per cent, because of the slow speed at which the trailer travels, assures a maximum total tire capacity of 467,725 pounds.
