This morning the sky was mostly clear although the weather prediction for tonight and Saturday was partly cloudy, and slightly cooler in Eastern Oregon.

Thursday's maximum was 75 above and the minimum last night was 49. At 7 o'clock this morning the mercury was up to 56 above.
