escape a machine gun trap in a St. Paul apartment house.

Slightly afterward deputy marshals raised a safety deposit box of the Lincoln Safe Deposit company of the northside, presumably to recover bonds and cash stolen by the Dillinger mob from banks in Mason City, Iowa and Sioux Falls, S. D.

Only a small amount of cash and some jewelry were found, but that said gave rise to a report, which was denied by the authorities, that the Prechete girl had, in language of the underworld, "squeaked."

Despite the "genial" extraordinary precautions were taken to cope with a possible attempt by Dillinger to take her from federal officers, who had held her incommunicado since last Monday.

Officers armed with machine guns surrounded her at every turn and at strategic spots yesterday when she was arraigned before U. S. Commissioner Edwin K. Walker on a removal warrant to Minnesota.

She was finally taken to jail to await the hearing.

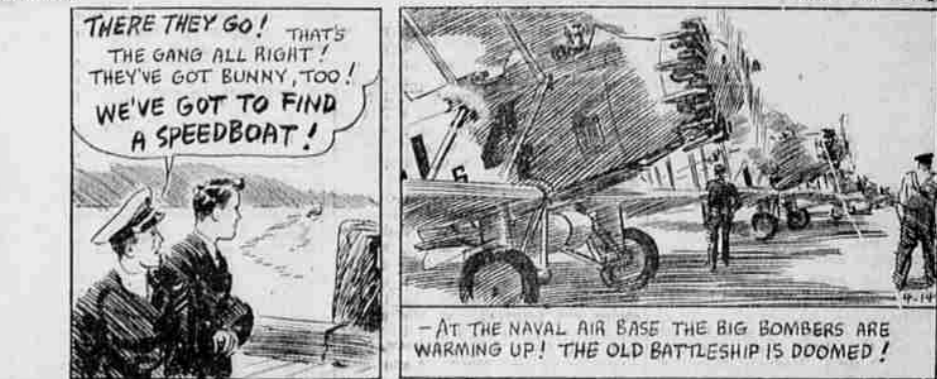
