

### American Wheat Reduction Plan Will be Studied

ROME, Apr. 19 (AP) — Delegates to the Rome meeting of the world wheat advisory commission went home today with a lot of work done but with a new unsolved problem awaiting their attention when they meet again at London in June.

A suggestion of the United States that further reduction of wheat acreage would be necessary to eliminate surpluses among wheat-exporting nations was favorably received by representatives of the major producers with the exception of Australia.

The commission placed consideration of the question on the agenda for its June meeting in London.

The federal government's investigation of Dillinger's escape from an apartment in St. Paul after a gun fight today placed two more persons in jail charged with harboring a fugitive—Dr. Clayton E. May and his nurse employe, Mrs. Gurnath La Delle.

In Pana, Ill. four men, one of whom witnesses said resembles photographs of Dillinger, held up the Pana National bank and escaped in an automobile with cash and securities estimated at \$30,000. Gus Smith, 39, bank janitor was knocked unconscious and robbed of his keys. The latest previous rumor of Dillinger's engagements was a bank robbery at Shreveport, La., yesterday, in which it was thought he participated.

Two men and a well-dressed youthful appearing woman robbed the Edwardsville, Kan. state bank of \$1,480 early today and escaped in a sedan answering the general description of the car used by Clyde Barrow, southwestern bandit, and Bonnie Parker, K. H. Beach, vice president of the bank, and Arthur Knight, 22, a laborer, were kidnaped by the bandits and taken to Monticello, Kan. where they were released. Officers believed that the bandits as described by Beach and Knight answered the descriptions of Barrow, Bonnie Parker and either Henry Metvin or Raymond Hamilton, escaped convicts from Huntsville prison in Texas.

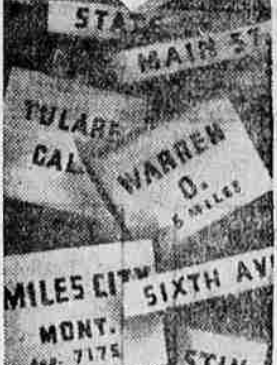
There will be 200 men at each camp. For the most part these men are from Illinois and they have been working in other western camps during the winter.

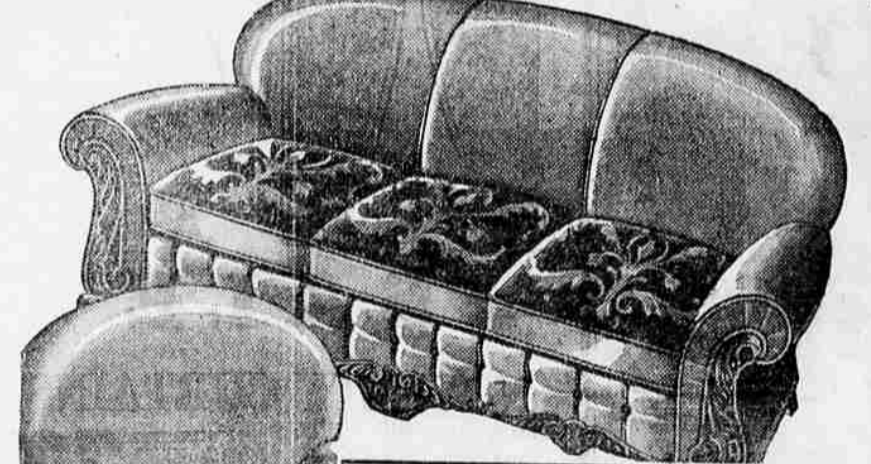
