publican party, 2607 for the Democratic party, and a miscellaneous total of 120.

There were 3534 persons registered expressing Republican preference at the last special election, 3208 expressing Democratic preference and 137 in the miscellaneous group. This made a total of 7279 registered voters for the last special election, and the registration which just closed exceeded that number by 585.

On the closing day of registration, a steady stream of last minute registrants was pouring into the court house, and a large portion of this increase was gained on the final day.
