Roosevelt Bowl At Pendleton Is Ready For Use

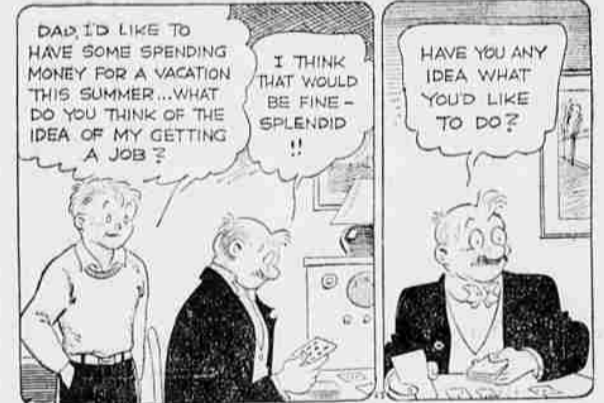
PENDLETON, Ore. (Special)—The "Roosevelt Bowl," an amphitheatre designed and planned by Roy Raley and George Strand, members of the city public parks commission has recently been completed at the Round-Up park. Six tiers of turf, in semi-circular formation before the stage, provide seating capacity of about 1000. The stage, about 70 by 15 feet, is semi-circular in the foreground, with a rectangular block rising at the rear. Approach to the upper stage is gained by three sets of stone steps at the front and on either side. Clusters of shrubbery have been grouped around the upper section. The outdoor theatre is now ready for use.

The Taylor Memorial and Pioneer parks will be open for supervised playgrounds June 18, for a ten-week season, when Miss Conover Hanlan will arrive to take charge. Mrs. A. C. McIntyre, chairman of the playground committee, announced Tuesday. This will be Miss Hanlan's fifth year in such work here. She is a graduate of Oregon State college, and this year has been taking a course in health education at the University of Washington. She will be assisted in her work by Helen DeWilde, who will be graduated from the Eastern Oregon normal school at La Grande in June. The parks are being put in condition now and the bandstand at Pioneer park is getting a coat of paint.

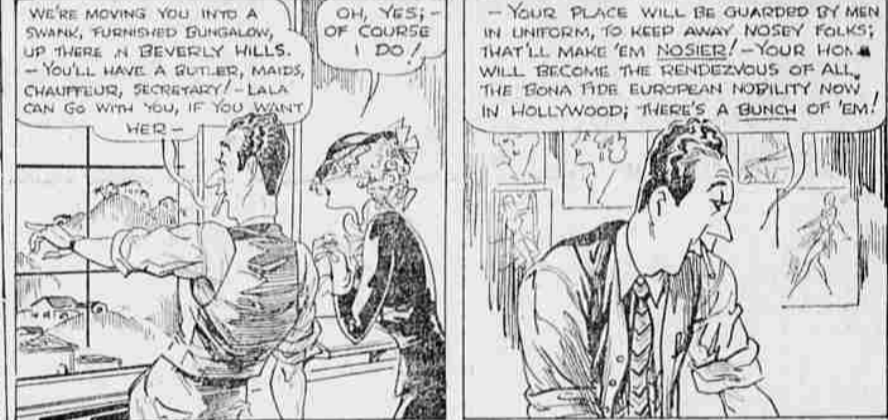
