## FIFTH OF INCH OF RAIN FALLS IN LA GRANDE

Nearly a fifth of an inch of rain fell in La Grande yesterday and Monday night, and heavier rain was reported in the Imbler and some other sections of the county. Fair weather predicted for today had not shown up this morning but the weatherman in Portland remained hopeful of fair skies tomorrow and rising temperatures in Eastern Oregon Thursday.

Wednesday's maximum was 52, above and the minimum 48, a range of only four degrees.

Nearly all of Oregon was damped by rain yesterday. Baker had 44 of an inch, Umatilla 22, The Dalles 25, Walla Walla .04, Salem 43, Portland 30, Albany 12, Eugene .05, and Medford .38.

## Woman Prevents Texas Kidnaping

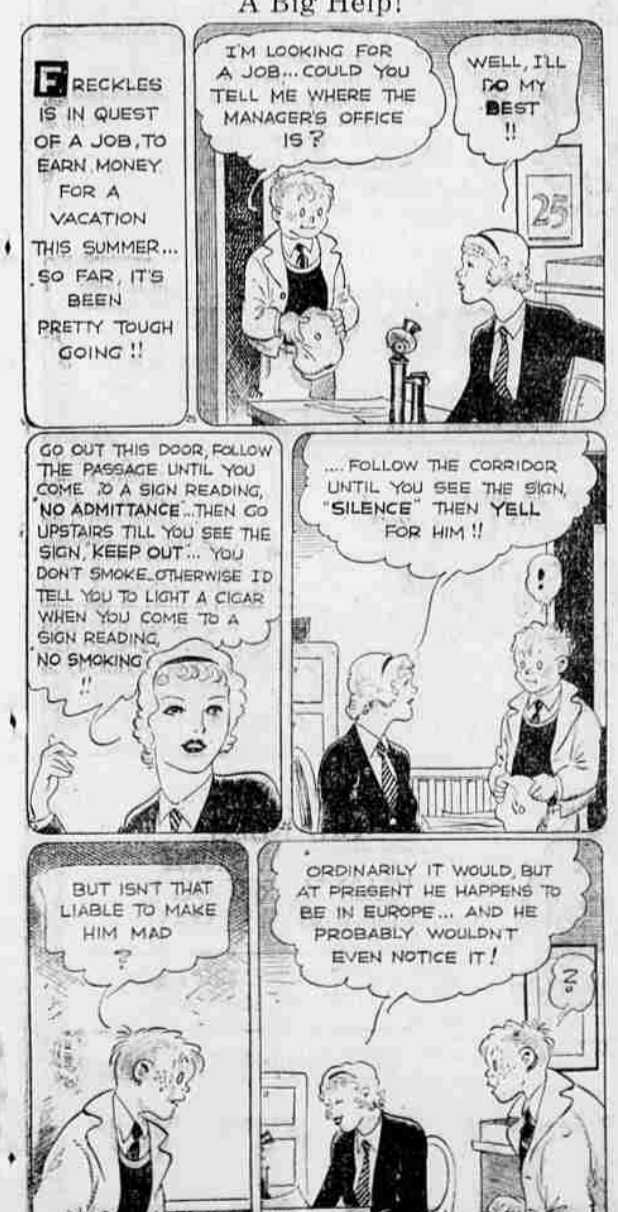
