

O-Ne-E Girls In Camp Fire Work Demonstration

The O-Ne-E Camp Fire Leadership group of the Eastern Oregon Normal school gave a varied and interesting program presenting camp fire work as an assembly Tuesday. Miss Katharine Monahan introduced the program telling of the beginning of camp fire in La Grande.

Miss Margaret Carstairs, director of the group, then sketched the national organization of camp fire which as started in March 1912 with the purpose of promoting "a program to take care of the out of school time of adolescent girls. This program involves seven crafts: home craft, path craft, handicraft, camp craft, art, craft, business craft, and patriotism and citizenship. Recognition work done in these crafts is in the form of colored bead awards. There

- is much use of symbolism, ceremony, and ritual.
- With evergreen trees and a camp fire for background, much of this symbolism and ritual was shown in the following Gypsy Council Fire:
1. Entrance of all the girls in O-Ne-E group singing Wo-he-la chant.
 2. Hand sign (based on the rising smoke of the fire, symbol of hope, growth, and ambition.)
 3. Gypsy fire lighting ceremony.
 4. "Walking song" sung by the group.
 5. The lure of the trail, Lili Hoffmann.
 6. "A vagabond song"—by Bliss Carner, read by Ethel Hoop.
 7. Morning trails — Donie Ruttle Thurston.
 8. Evening trails — Rowena Wilkes.
 9. Camp Fires — Esther Laughlin.
 10. "Dance of the Seven Crafts," given by the members of Miss Edna Brown's camp fire group: Marcia Miller, Floy Wetzel, Beth Fross, Jean Buchanan, Sara Patten, Jean Jasper, Bess May Maxon.
 11. "Berga-man" and "Mummy Moon," songs sung by O-Ne-E group.
 12. Gypsy fire extinguishing ceremony — Carmen Gordon.
